JANE: Did he telephone again last night?

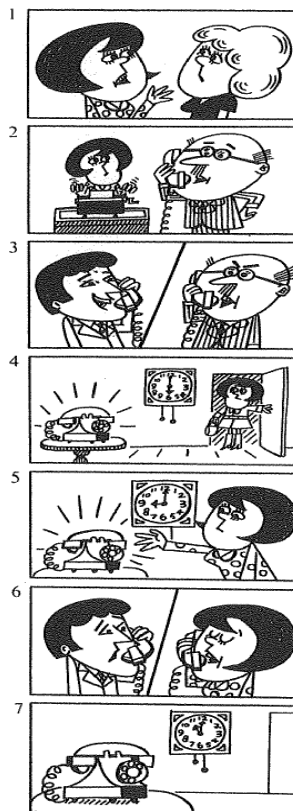
PAULINE: Yes, he did.

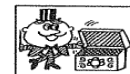
