



Background

– A clear disadvantage:

Evidence shows that students with low socio-economic background or students with disabilities are less likely to participate in mobility programmes (Hauschildt et al., 2015; King, Findlay and Ahrens, 2010; Souto Otero, 2008), further deepening their already disadvantaged position among their peers.

Background

- Possible causes
 - High costs (Insufficient support)
 - Lack of general information on the host centre
 - Lack of personalised monitoring
 - Uncertainty on adaptations and accessibility
 - Others: family overprotection, medical impediments, etc.


2. Topic 2: User profiles

- Responses from administrator (giving more data, clarifying something, etc.): 1
- Comments (without names):
 - 1. I think is good. The only users that can edit are the Super administrator and the University staff, is this right?
 - We had a meeting with our Disability team and they suggest that providers of services for people with disabilities should be able to offer their services in the City (ex. Rent of wheelchair, care services...)
 - 3. I think this sums up all kinds of users quite nicely. If possible it might be a good idea to have two of three different levels in University Staff:
 - 1. disability staff more access to sensitive information
 - 2. international/academic staff-access to student data but not to details
 - 4. Lagree with comment 3
 - Comment 3 sounds reasonable. So, if a student wants to add Information he/she could address either the
 administrator or the university staff to have it published, right? By including students in the process to gather
 Information (e.g. if a building is barrier free) one can raise their awareness for these sensitive topics.
 - 6. I do agree with comment 3
 - 7. Ithink that they are the right users but security levels must be established in the access the data.
- Evaluation of the topic asked: in general, right.
- Suggestions for improvement:
 - Including different levels in university staff: disability staff (having access to more sensitive information)
 and international/academic staff
 - 2. Specifying security levels in data accessing.
 - 3. Include information of providers of services for people with disabilities
